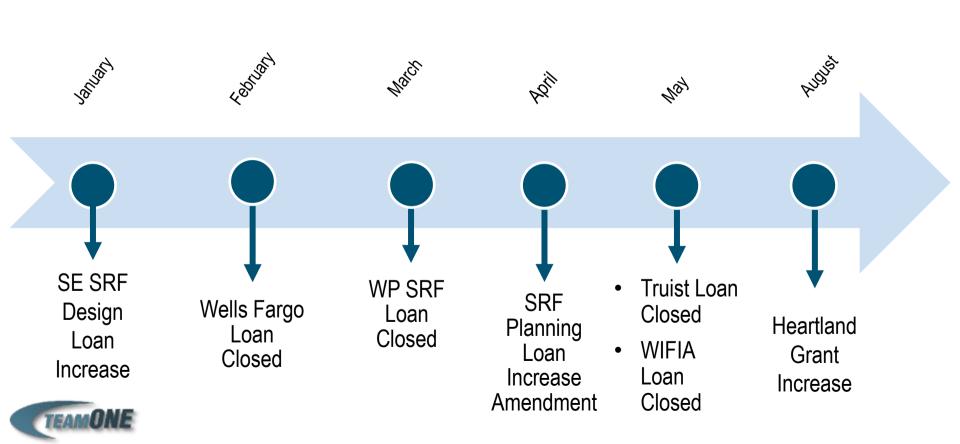

2024 Business Plan Highlights



Grand total has increased from last year.

- Incorporates third party operator input on operational expenses, including fixed and variable charges.
- Incorporates 15% contingency, requested by WIFIA (may require a future bank loan in addition to the existing WIFIA & SRF loans).
- Reflects the District's plans to delay reimbursements (requires interim funding source supported by Member payments).



Member payments delayed to incorporate updated construction schedule.

- SE water delivery in October 2027.
- WP water delivery October 2028.
- Variable expenses based on each members allocated capacity for Phase 1 (Actual charges will be based on water delivery).



2024 Business Plan Highlights

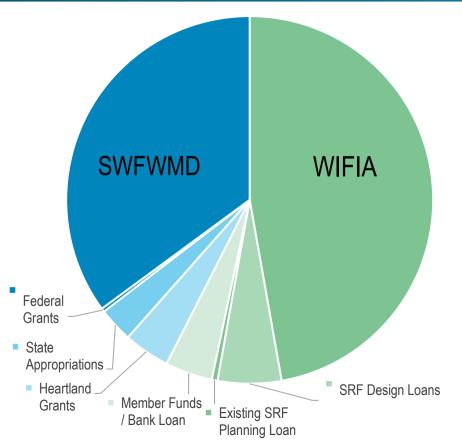


Consistent with Adopted Reserve Policy

- Incorporates 1.25 debt service coverage margin.
- DSRF, R&R Fund, and O&M Reserve Policy amounts fully funded well ahead of FY 2032.
- By FY 2032 combined projects hold ~ \$10M in operating reserves in the Reserve Fund above the 90-day requirement.
- While these funds *may* be distributed back to the members, they *may* also be used for any legal purpose approved by the Board of Directors.

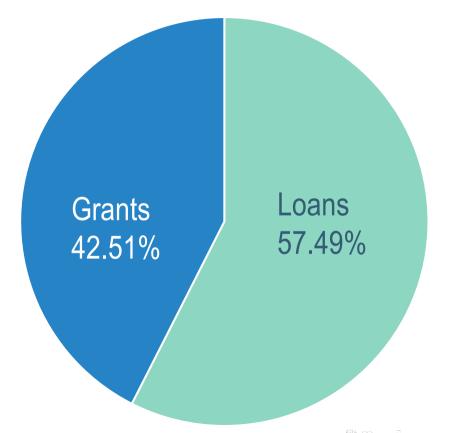

How can we reduce costs?

- Competitive contractor bidding.
- Take advantage of any lower market rates (WIFIA, Truist, etc.).
- Continue the dialog with the WMD on their planned reimbursement schedule.
- Work collaboratively to maximize grant opportunities.



Member Revenue Options

- 1 Member special assessments
- ² Capital connection fees
- 3 AWS surcharges
- 4 Monthly user fees





Member Special Assessments

- Charges assessed against the property of a particular locality because that property derives some <u>special benefit</u> from the expenditure of the money
- Examples of other types of special assessments: fire protection, street improvements, septic to sewer, etc.
- Requires a method be developed to spread costs among benefited properties
- Spreads cost across more than just current customers of the utility system
- Not an option previously favored by members



Capital Connection Fees

- Charges imposed against new development, rather than existing customers
- Matches capital cost of facilities to the demand for capacity created by new development
- One-time fee collected as growth occurs
- May be pledged to support member's share of project capital-related debt service requirements

- Adds an additional user fee to a ratepayer's monthly bill to recover the operating and/or financing costs of the AWS project
- Can be presented as
 - % increase to water base and usage charge
 - Per-account flat charge
 - Allocation based on meter size
 - Flat charge per 1,000 gallons (Kgal)
- Polk County implemented a \$0.30/Kgal surcharge in 2017

4 Monthly User Fees

- Typically fund cost of operating and financing utility systems
- Fund capital and O&M requirements
- Should be just and equitable
- Charged in exchange for a governmental service
- Are paid by current customers of the system
- Amount should recover all AWS operating and financing costs not recovered from assessments, capital connection fees, and/or AWS surcharges



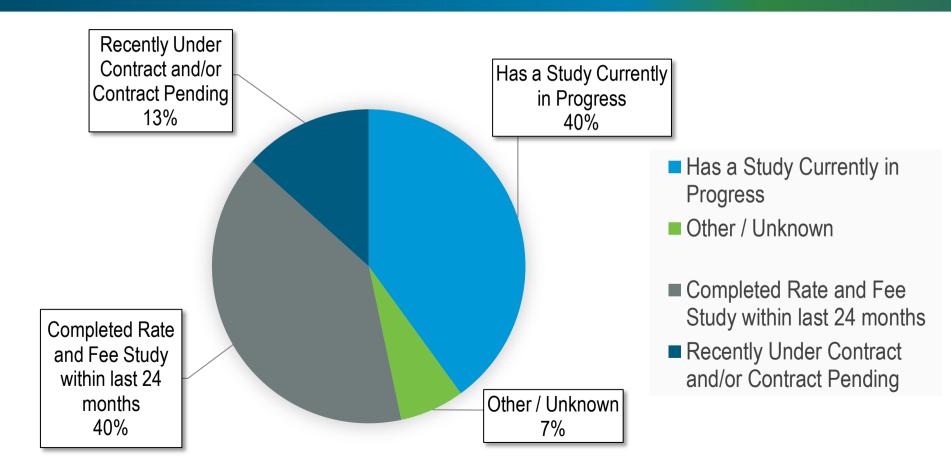

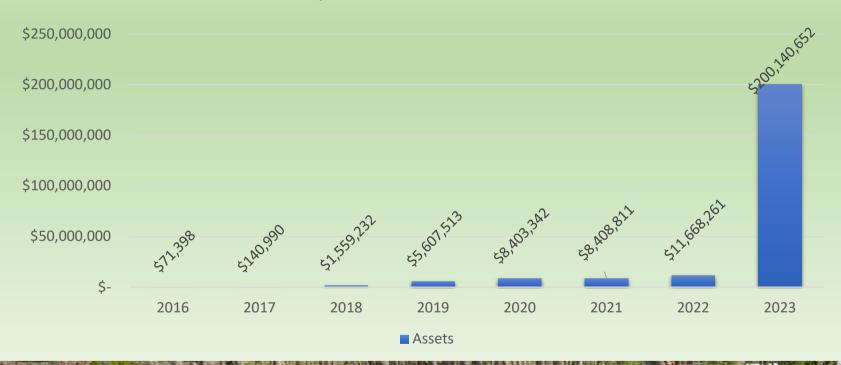
Revenues and Expenses (including capitalized costs), inception to 2023

Conservation Implementation Agreement

- September 2023 PRWC BOD approved FY2024 Conservation Budget
 - \$150,000 (\$75,000 member funded / \$75,000 Heartland grant)
- Conservation Project Implementation Agreement needed to use funds
 - To be implemented using third-party provider
 - Focus on:
 - Rebate programs
 - Reimburse members for their conservation programs
 - Outreach and advertising
 - Administrative tasks
 - Each member will need to execute the agreement at respective City Council/Commission meetings
 - Next step procurement to obtain third-party provider

- Southeast Wellfield TPW#3 now completed
 - A.C. Schultes of Florida \$3,697,690
- West Polk Wellfield TPW#2 next site
 - Estimated cost \$5,000,000 (to be paid by SRF loan)
- Four production wells sites at Southeast Wellfield (9, 10, 11, and 14)
 - Estimated cost \$2,650,000 each (to be paid by Truist/WIFIA loan)
- New well driller procurement necessary to proceed
 - Lakeland will lead
- Results of Procurement will be brought to BOD for review/approval

Background and Scope

- Early bid package for Detour Road, Alford Road, Edwards Road corridors (Lake Hamilton/Dundee area)
 - Hamilton Bluffs, Alford Ridge and Landings at Lake Trask developments
 - Currently in construction or starting construction in next 12 months
 - Building segments now will reduce construction cost
- Approximately 7,250 linear feet of 30-inch ductile iron pipe (DIP) including valves and other appurtenances



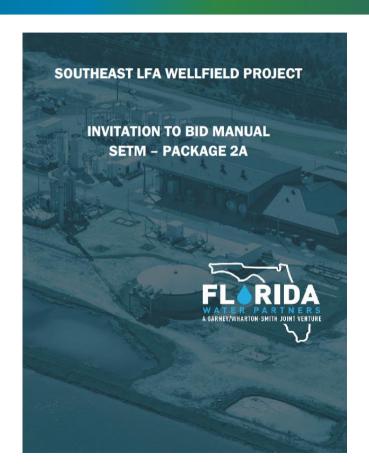


Bid Recap

- Bid advertisement January 25, 2024
- Bids received February 22, 2024

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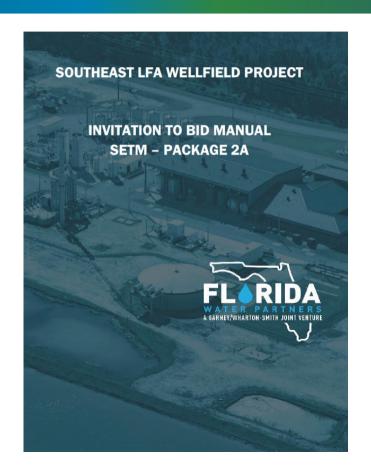

- Pricing significantly lower than 60% construction cost estimate
 - 30" DIP \$371.50 vs \$535.38 (31% lower)
 - 30" valves \$26K vs \$88.5K (71% lower)





Bid Analysis and Recommendation

- Proposed construction schedule determined to be a factor for CMAR General Conditions
 - Killebrew 12 months
 - Garney Companies 9 months
 - Carr & Collier 8 months
- Shorter construction duration = lower GCs
- GC's include FWP costs to manage contractor:
 - Staff time (PMs, engineers, etc.)
 - Project administrative costs

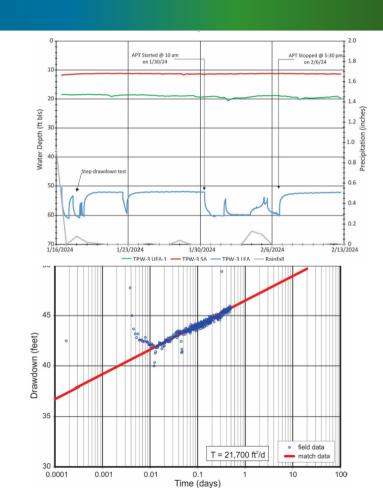

Production Wells

- Test Production Well No. 3
 - Construction of test well TPW3 completed on December 12, 2023
 - Aquifer performance test (APT) complete
 - Transmissivity value within the expected range and on the high side
 - Water quality similar to WPF test well
- Site acquisition complete for Well Nos. 10 and 11
- Site acquisition in progress for Well Nos. 9 and 14





Injection Well-1

- Installation of 30-inch casing complete to 2,560' Below Land Surface (BLS)
- Completed pilot hole to 3,700' BLS
- Reaming pilot hole currently at 2,800' BLS +/-
- 545 calendar days contract duration
 - Testing scheduled for November 2024
 - Final completion anticipated January 2025
- Construction agreement allows for consideration of a future change order to construct a second injection well (if required)

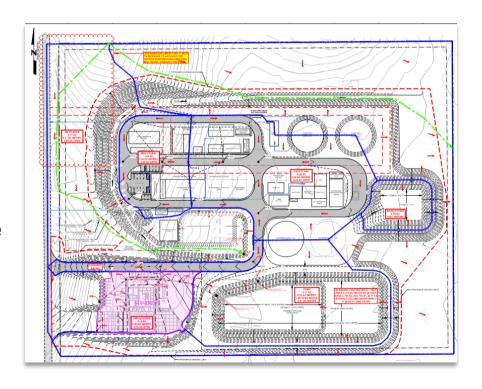






Water Production Facility

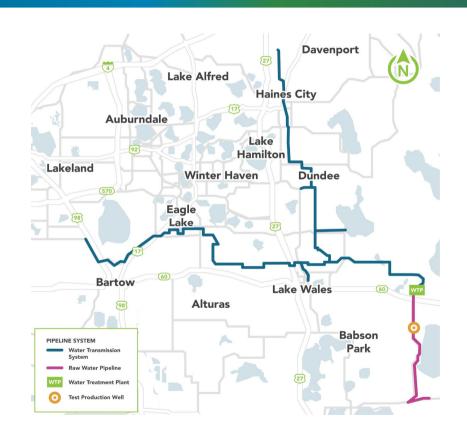
- 90% design commenced in October 2023
 - Project team continues to evaluate cost reductions
 - Site layout update complete
 - Third Party Operator feedback is being addressed
- 90% design completion scheduled for June 2024
- Guaranteed Maximum Price (GMP) anticipated in November of 2024





Transmission Mains

- 90% design in progress
 - Project team continues to evaluate cost reductions
- 90% design completion scheduled for spring 2024
- Goal is to complete design documents for bidding
 - Six (6) construction packages
 - Bidding will be staggered to allow local contractors to bid on multiple segments
 - GMP will be developed for each package

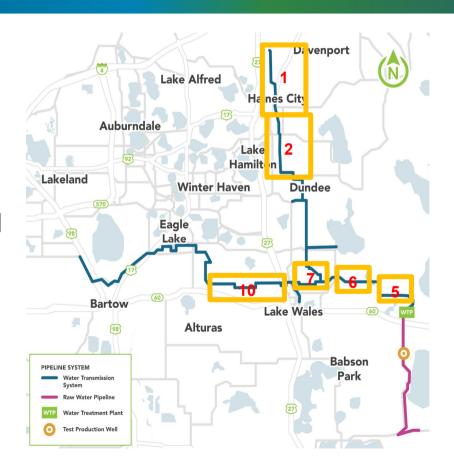

The nature, terms and duration of the nonexclusive permanent easement (the "Easement") which the Polk Regional Water Cooperative ("PRWC") acquires from the property owners/interest holders ("Owner) of the real property shown and described on Exhibit "A" are:

- 1. The permanent perpetual water line Easement interests and rights acquired by PRWC are the exclusive and perpetual right, privilege and authority to construct, install, maintain, operate, inspect, patrol, ingress and egress, test, repair, alter, substitute, relocate, resize, replace and remove the water transmission line or lines and related fixtures and/or appurtenances thereto, and vehicular and pedestrian access over the Easement Area, for the transmission of water and such other improvements as are reasonably necessary in connection with the water supply project for the PRWC.
- 2. In the event that the construction and installation of the water transmission line or lines and related fixtures and/or appurtenances thereto impact Owner's improvements, PRWC shall, to the extent practicable, relocate or replace with the same, like, or better quality and at their original locations or a near as is reasonably practicable, all fences, roads, driveways, sidewalks, parking areas, irrigation systems, well, septic tanks and septic drain fields, that PRWC damaged or cause to be removed, relocated or replaced from the Easement Area before or during initial construction and installation of the

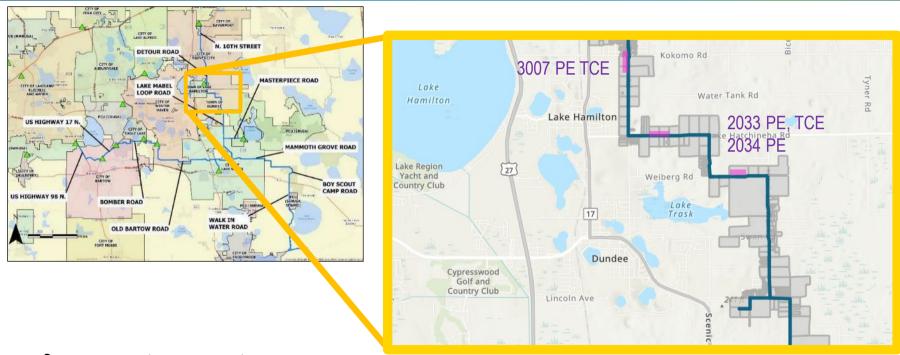

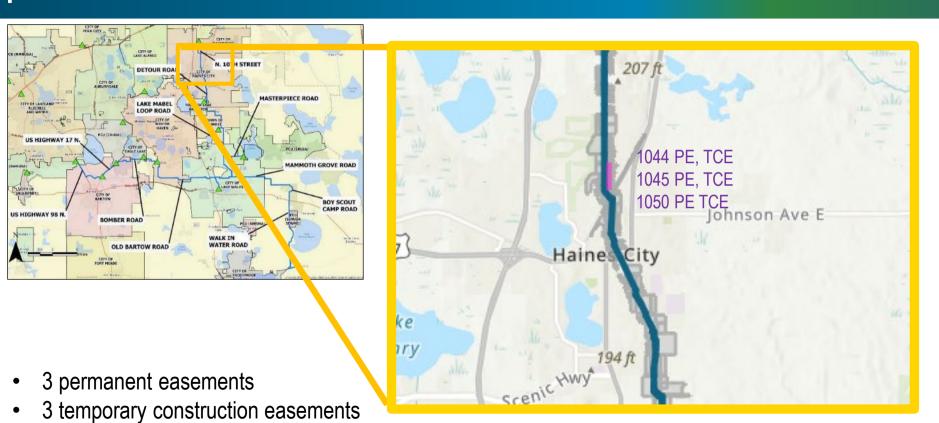
- Cooperative Board approved construction of SEWF raw water and finished water transmission mains pursuant to Resolution 2023-06
- Resolutions 2024-7 through 2024-10 constitute Parcel Resolutions
 - Authorizes the Cooperative to acquire permanent easements over 14 parcels (Exhibits A & B) and temporary construction easements over 13 parcels (Exhibits C & D).
- Acquisition by negotiation, contract or legal proceedings
 - Includes eminent domain proceedings pursuant to Chapter 73 and 75, Florida Statutes

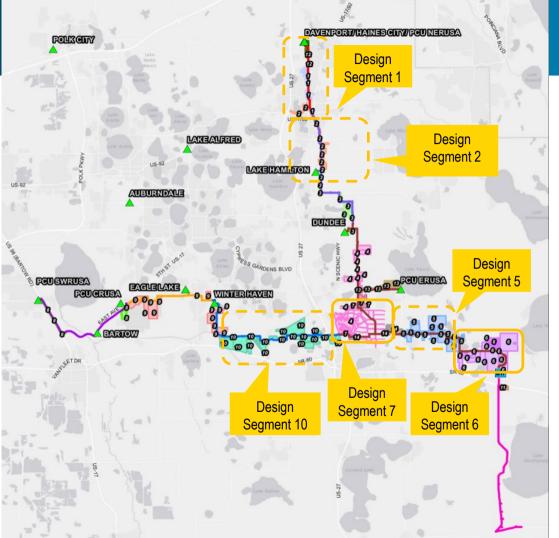

Overall Progress

- Temporary and/or permanent easements needed on over 300 parcels, across 11 segments.
- Resolutions to pursue condemnation (if necessary) for all of Segment 5, 6 and 7 parcels have been approved; along with approximately 1/2 of Segment 10 and select parcels from Segments 1 and 2.
- Settlements have been reached on 42 parcels, totaling over \$2,600,000

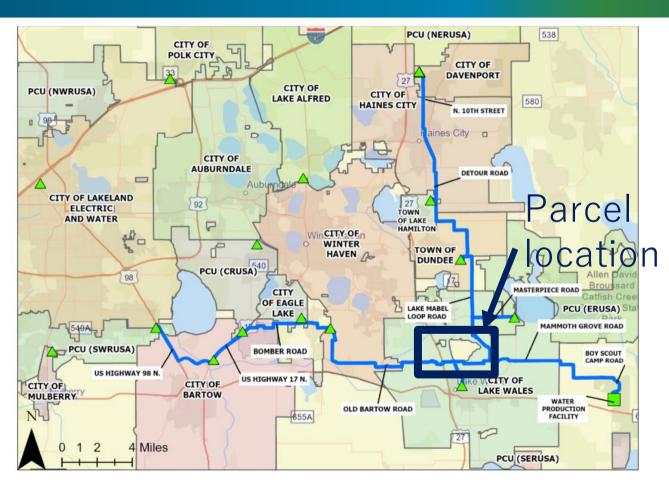
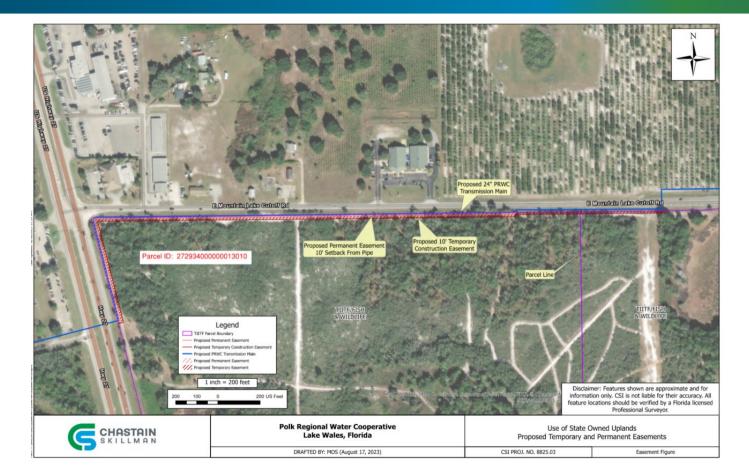
